Associate Membership is for those ladies who have moved from the district or have health or domestic problems but who still wish to keep their connection with Coulsdon Court Ladies Golf Club. Members who wish to become Associate Members must apply to the Committee for their change of membership to be considered.

- Associate Membership will also be considered for those members who, because they belong to another club, are unable to play with any regularity at Coulsdon Court Ladies Club.
- Associate Members are eligible to play in the Club competitions, listed below, (a); however should they come first in a Trophy competition they can win a prize, but are not eligible to receive the trophy. This will be presented to the Member who is in second place.
- Associate Members cannot play in knockouts competitions; Associate Members can play in the Interclub Friendly Competitions with the Artisan, Vets and Men's Club.
- Associate Members are not eligible to represent Coulsdon Court Ladies Club in any Regional events.
- Associate Members may invite a guest to play with them on Invitation Day; they may not come as a guest of another Member.

## Clarification to rules added at AGM 2013

• "Associate Members are not eligible for Medal Competitions or those events where there is a Club Trophy or when the winner/winners of a competition go forward to represent the Club in a Regional Event. However, they may attend the Christmas lunch, Captain's Day lunch. Spring and Autumn Meeting meals, Invitation Day meal and can play in the following:

(a):Non-Trophy Stablefords
Club Outing
Texas Scramble
Holly & Ivy
Invitation Day with an invited quest

Spring and Autumn Meetings Not eligible for the Trophy. Social Membership is for those ladies who are no longer able to play but who wish to remain in close contact, joining the players on a Wednesday after the club game and to attend the social events that occur during the year including meals and gatherings after any of the Clubs special games, days, or outings.

Members who wish to become Social Members must apply to the Committee for their change of membership to be considered.

## **Honorary Members**

Honorary Status is awarded by the Committee to a member, usually of long standing who, during their time with the Club, has served as Captain, Secretary or Treasurer or, as is often the case, undertaken all of these roles. Upon receiving a proposal that a member warrants/is deserving of this status, usually coming from the acting Captain, or a Committee member, the Committee will take a vote and if in agreement the candidate will receive Lifetime Honorary Membership effective from the date of the following AGM, thereafter no further Annual Subscriptions are due.
