

PAR BISQUE

Par Bisque – The competition is Matchplay against the course. The course is your opponent. Players receive full handicap allowance and they can decide when they use their shots as opposed to following the stroke index. This must be done after each hole and before teeing off on the next hole, eg if a player takes 7 shots on a par 5 they could use 2 shots to halve the hole or they could decide to use shots to win the hole.

The object of the game is to use shots where they would be most beneficial.

The winner is the player who finishes the most holes up against par (see example score card)

If players beat net par they mark the card with their gross score and a plus (+). If net par is not achieved they mark the card with a minus (-). The result is calculated by deducting the number of minus holes from the number of plus holes. Halved holes are not taken into account. It is very important to mark both the gross score, shots used and the hole result. Failure to do so will result in disqualification. The player who finishes the most holes up against par (or the least holes down!) is the winner.”
